## THE NURSERY DAY

We offer three different sessions with a minimum requirement of four sessions per week.

MORNING: 8.30am – 11.45am  
ALL DAY (including lunch): 8.30am – 3.15pm  
AFTERNOON: 12.45pm – 3.15pm

Healthy snacks are provided during each session, and a nutritional lunch is freshly prepared at school each day by our fantastic catering team, using seasonal and local ingredients. Lunch can be included as an optional extra with morning and afternoon sessions.

Busy working parents may wish to extend their child's day by making use of our wrap around early morning care (8.00-8.30am) and after school care (3.30-5.45pm) which takes place in Teddy's Lodge, at school. After school care is booked in advance through the School Gateway. Run by our own staff, Teddy's Lodge includes a kitchen and dining area, sitting room with comfy sofas, a conservatory and playroom, and its own secure outdoor play area.

## WHEN CAN MY CHILD JOIN THE NURSERY?

Children can join the Nursery in September, after they have turned three years old. Children join KES Nursery for their pre-school year.

## FUNDING

We offer the 15 hours universal funding and the 30 hours extended funding, but charge for the extras we provide such as Forest School and specialist teaching sessions.

Three light and airy indoor spaces provide free-flow movement and access to the Nursery's dedicated and flexible outdoor space, with its mix of investigation areas including a sandpit, stage and dressing up corner, raised beds for growing plants and vegetables, climbing area, mud kitchen, block play and loose parts construction.

### FAMILY FOCUSED

We believe working in close partnership with parents is paramount to a child's success.

We continue to develop our relationship with parents in a number of ways during the Nursery year. Each child's journey through Nursery is shared through an Interactive Learning Diary which both staff and parents can contribute to.

Parents can arrange to 'stay & play' with their child and see first-hand what children are learning.

Open sessions each term provide a chance for parents to spend a morning in the Nursery and get involved in a range of activities that support their child's skills and learning. In addition, our termly review process gives individual time for parents and the Nursery staff to meet and talk about their child's current interests, skills and development.

### HOME VISITS & SETTLING IN

Two members of our Nursery team aim to visit every child at their home, prior to starting in

Nursery. Children will also be invited to school to meet their new teachers and to see their new teaching environment.

A home visit before your child joins us in Nursery gives everyone an opportunity to get to know one another in an environment where your child feels safe and secure. It also provides you with an opportunity to share information about your child and for us to explain what happens in Nursery and to answer any queries or concerns you may have.

We have found that the home visits are a very positive experience, often recalled by the children, who frequently ask if we can visit their home again!

### OUTDOOR FOCUSED

At King Edward's, the outdoor environment is an integral part of the learning environment and we are proud of our status as a Forest School. As well as allowing children to engage directly with the environment, outdoor learning also enhances many different elements of the curriculum and enriches school life.
